Funding has been secured for a new option appraisal exercise and an initial site meeting was held on 8 October. This project is being partly funded by the Scottish Government and the European Community and Argyll and the Islands Leader 2007-2013 programme. Funding is also being provided by Argyll and Bute Council, The Architectural Heritage Fund and RIAS Scottish Community Projects Fund. We are being assisted in this work by the Strathclyde Building Preservation Trust.

We will be conducting a thorough consultation with the local community in the next few weeks, but in the meantime if there are any fresh ideas on a sustainable use for the building do pass them on via the <u>contact us</u> page of our website.
